PARENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE COUNCIL

2018/2019 has been another great year for Glenella School Parent Advisory Council.

In December we fundraised over \$1000 by catering the TRSD Professional Development in-service lunch. Thanks to parent's food donations, and all our workers and volunteers, it was a successful and well-run event.

In May we organized a Mother's Day Tea & Fashion Show at the Glenella School. Models fashioned clothes sewn by local designer Marg Post. Some Glenella School students and parents had fun modeling her designs. Volunteers donated cakes, dainties, coffee, tea, their time and more to help make this day fun. Along with a silver collection, PAC received 20% of show sales bringing in approximately \$650 from this event. We decided to perhaps turn it into an annual show.

Many seeds and plants for our garden area were donated to the school, and the elementary students helped with the planting. We also had some grant money left over from the previous

year so Jessica Klassen spearheaded a tree planting project on the West side of the school playground.

With this year's fundraising efforts PAC was able to give \$400 toward this year's Elementary School Field trips. \$400 was also given to the school in the amounts of \$175, \$150, and \$75 to be presented to this year's top 3 graduating students with the highest grades.

This May we started a "365 day" fundraiser through the FlipGive program. It is a phone/tablet App that gives Glenella School PAC a percentage back when our registered users shop online (AMAZON, INDIGO, Home Depot, Etc.) It seems to be a profitable and easy fundraising tool for us.

On June 15th we had a community wide yard sale at the Glenella Curling Rink, raising \$300.

On behalf of PAC I'd like to thank Glenella School staff, students, parent volunteers and our community for all your strong efforts. None of this is possible without any of you.
