

GRADE 5/6

Iln English, we have continued with our unit on figurative language. We have learnt that similes are comparing to objects using the words "like" or "as" and metaphors are comparing objects by saying something "is" something else. Each grade have now read the first few chapters on their novels, "Double Fudge" or "Bridge to Terabithia".

The 5/6's have completed our science unit on "Forces and Simple Machines". The students learnt about the wheel and axle, levers, pulleys, wedges, inclined planes, gears, and screws. Their final assignment was to take all their knowledge and write down the advantages and disadvantages of each simple machine. Then they had to choose which one they would use to move a piano to a second story in a building. The 5/6's will be starting their next social studies unit "The Fur Trade".

In math, both grades have been learning about perimeter, area and volume. We have learned many formulas and included these on a cheat sheet. We will be writing our test before Spring Break. Our next unit will be on patterns and t-tables.

In French, the 5/6's are reviewing animals and learning how say which habitat they belong. We will be creating a poster about an animal and its' habitat and creating French sentences to explain our pictures.

We have gone to McCreary to attend cross-country skiing lessons this month. The class really enjoyed the trails, especially when there was hills to go down! However, we did not like walking up them as much. Some of our classmates went to Minnedosa to go down-hill skiing. Once everyone got off the bunny hill, they were flying down the slopes!
