


To keep the fun rolling, we have began fundraising for our end of year class field trip with

K-2 SKATING


Grade 3/4

In Math we are reviewing addition and subtraction with regrouping. We have been working with money, learning the value of coins along with counting back change. This unit we have enjoyed "shopping" and adding up items we have purchased. We continue to practice our mental math and review place value through a variety of games.

This month we started reading, "The One and Only Ivan" for our novel study. We continue to work on cursive and spelling. We are also learning about antonyms and synonyms and are working on our sentences and enjoy our buddy reading. Our new unit in Science is on Habitats and Communities. We are learning about different habitats, which animals and plants live there and how they adapt to survive. We just finished our posters on endangered and extinct animals. We have started going skating for Phys. Ed. Everyone is doing a great job and enjoying being on the ice.

Grade 5/6 Cross Country Skiing







Grade 5/6

In English, the 5/6's have been working on recognizing parts of speech in sentences. They can identify nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs. We have finished our novel study "Summer of Riley" and will be starting new novels soon. The Grade 5's will be reading "Double Fudge", while the Grade 6's will be reading "Bridge to Terabithia". The class has been learning about persuasion paragraphs. We have learnt we need an introduction, three reasons/examples, and a conclusion to build our paragraph.

We have started our Social Studies unit on Early European Colonization. So far the 5/6's have researched a European country that explored Canada and the reasons why they wanted to explore Canada. We have discussed the positive and negative interactions the Europeans and First Nations groups had when the Europeans first came to Canada.


In Math, both grades have been learning about angles. We have learnt about acute, obtuse, straight, right and reflex angles. The class has been learning to use a protractor to measure these types of angles. They are constantly being reminded to make sure they are starting at zero degrees when trying to find the measurement of an angle! The 5/6's know that triangles need to equal 180 degrees, while quadrilaterals need to measure up to 360 degrees. While learning about angles, the class is working more and more on word problems and applying our knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division to figure out the solution.

In French, we are learning about the family members. We are creating family albums and labeling our family members while also writing a short sentence describing this family member.

The 5/6's have started skating in Phys. Ed class and we also have started cross country skiing! We are having lots of fun and doing great at these activities!






End of Term 1 Report

What did one raindrop say to the other?






