October's calendar is full of great presentations and activities! We look forward to a great month!

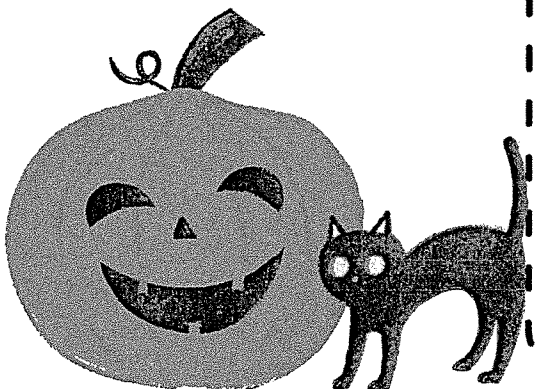

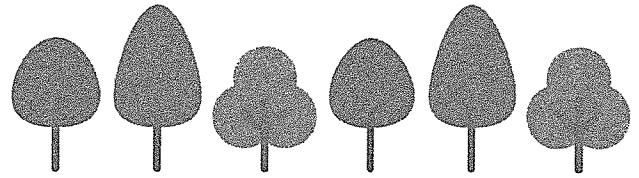

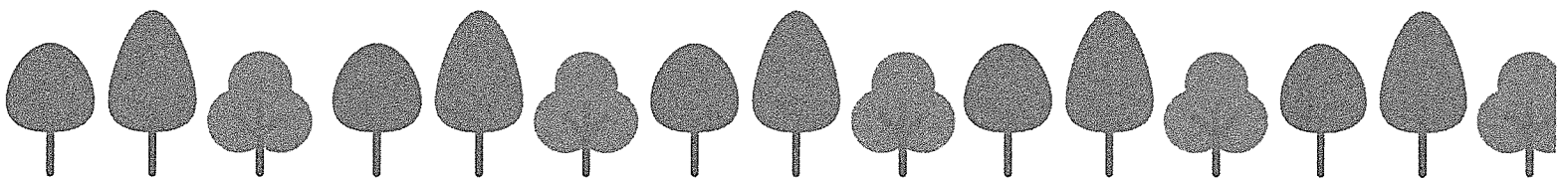

GRADE 5/6

CLASSROOM NEWS

Welcome to all students into the 5/6 classroom! It's been great to see everyone again. We have been busy with starting routines and getting back into the swing of things.

In English we have been doing a number of things already. The 5/6's have started weekly spelling work with our test always being at the end of the week. We have started our first whole class novel study on "The Summer of Riley". We have also begun writing paragraphs already! The students each wrote a paragraph all about them so I could learn more about each individual. We are now learning how to add description and detail in writing. We have reviewed the 5 senses and how it's important to add these into our writing. We will soon be completing a final descriptive paragraph assignment.

For science we have started the unit on "Maintaining a Healthy Body". We have learnt about the food groups and how to read food labels. In partners, the 5/6's each did a research project on a different system of our body and presented their findings to their classmates.

During math the 5/6's have reviewed place value. The grade 5's are learning place value up to the one hundred thousands and the grade 6's are learning up to the millions. We are also reviewing how to add with regrouping and how to subtract with borrowing. They just completed a unit test and now we will be learning about fractions.

We have started our French unit on greetings and have played a game to practice counting in French.

This month the 5/6's visited Laurier School to participate in our activity day. We also did the Terry Fox Walk around town.

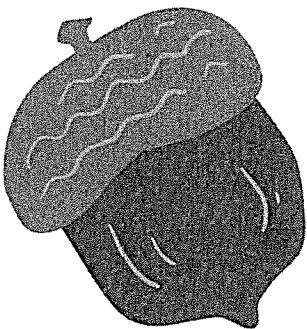
WITH MISS BARCLAY

Well, here we are again, back to school time! This semester students in Grade 9 start each day off with English and Digital Pictures! Analysis of the world around them through both literary and camera lenses are at the center of every Grade 9 student's morning. We have started our year out by diving into the structures and analysis of short stories and will soon be reading our class novel "Code Talkers". A historical fiction novel based on events from World War II, Joseph Bruchac tells the captivating and top-secret tale of Navajo soldiers who used their "unbreakable code" to help win the war against Japan.

Students in both Grades 9 and 10 are fulfilling their history requirement this semester by participating in Canada in the Contemporary World. By learning about the past and the present students are better equipped to shape the future of our country. In September students tackled the concept of Canadian citizenship. Human rights and the responsibilities that accompany them are the beginning theme of October.

In the Grade 7 and 8 English Language Arts classroom, mythology and folklore have dominated the return to school. Everything from the cultural and mythical roots of Halloween to researching and presenting mythical creatures from across the realms of folklore have been explored. Reading skills have also been a major focus of September in our classroom as students have been completing independent novels and making "good fit" book choices for themselves.

As we settle into school routines, we are excited to see what October brings with student creativity and exploration! October is going to be a busy month and report card time will be here before we know it so, please encourage your student to complete assignments promptly and take advantage of extra help opportunities available in class. There are many exciting activities and events happening in our school in October and we can hardly wait to see what new understandings and skills our students will take away from these opportunities!



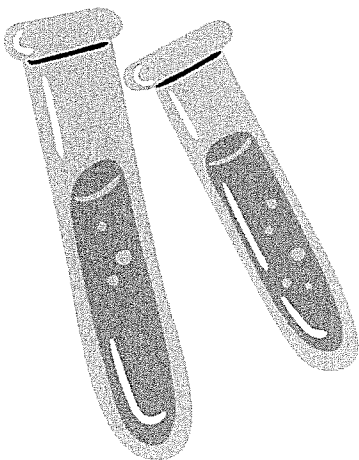
GREETINGS FROM THE SCIENCE LAB

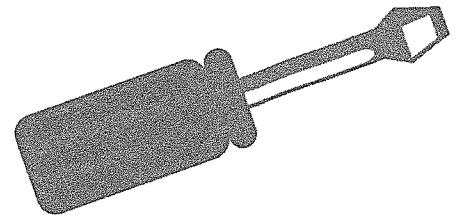
AUTOMOTIVE

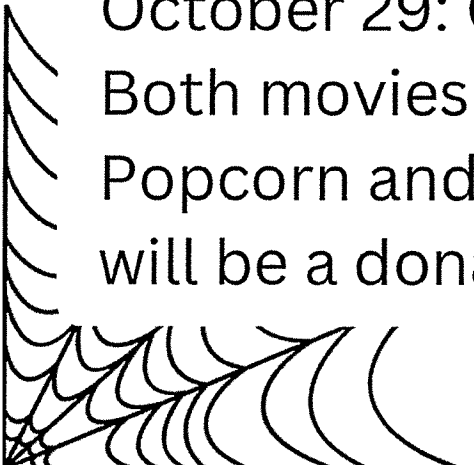
The Glenella Seniors Center will be holding two Halloween movie nights for kids.

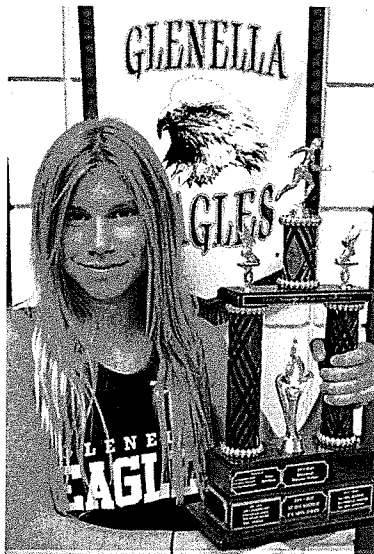
